Notes Letter to Ed. dated 28 April 1795, from Birdbrook, Essex.  
Walford describes the way to discover gravel or stone without the necessity of boring, merely by looking for the common white saxifrage (Saxifraga granulata). Although there is no botanical description of the plant, Walford gives references to its description in Curtis 'Flora Londiniensis' and in William Woodville's 'Medical botany'. Walford gives the dates of flowering, its habitats in Essex and Suffolk.
